
Reimagining Public Safety in Montgomery County Tuesday, March 30, 1:00-2:15pm

In response to the nationwide and local furor over racial injustice, County Executive Marc Elrich established The Reimagining Public Safety Taskforce in mid-year 2020, which included broad representation of community stakeholders. Their final report was released in February. Join Marc Mauer, former Executive Director of the Sentencing Project and one of the two Taskforce Co-Chairpersons, for an overview of their process, findings, and recommendations, with time for questions and discussion. PREPARE FOR THE COVID VACCINATION DAY AND AFTER

Are you scheduled to get your first or second dose of the Covid vaccine? Be prepared in case you have a significant flu-like reaction to it, as some of our members did.

Make sure you have the following on hand just in case: Tylenol or Advil (or their generic equivalents) for fever, muscle and joint pain, headache. And for the fatigue - something already prepared that is easy to eat like chicken soup with some cooked chicken in it, or whatever your easy to reheat comfort cuisine might be, and some toast, tea, etc.

For our members who live alone—if you wish, contact the Help Desk a few days in advance of when you are scheduled to be vaccinated to request a check-in phone call for the morning after that shot—to make sure you are OK, or if you need anything. Mass Vaccination Site Coming to Montgomery County

Maryland Governor Larry Hogan announced recently that a State mass vaccination site will open at the Germantown campus of Montgomery College. In addition to the Germantown site, the Governor announced five other new mass vaccination sites. In total, there will be a dozen sites throughout Maryland by the end of April. The Montgomery College site will open as a mass vaccination site the week of April 5, 2021. You may preregister for State mass vaccination clinics online or call 1-855-MDGOVAX (1-855-634-6829).

As of Tuesday, March 23, 2021, residents age 60 years and older are eligible to preregister for State vaccination sites.

Already Been Vaccinated? Please Cancel Your Preregistration. If you're already been vaccinated, you can now cancel your preregistration for a County-run clinic. Completing this form will remove you from their preregistration list.

A new sign-up program for vaccines: For weeks, state legislators and local leaders have pleaded with the Maryland Department of Health to institute a sign-up system for its COVID-19 vaccination program. On Saturday, Gov. Lawrence J. Hogan Jr. (R) announced a partial, but significant step in that direction — the creation of a pre-registration system for Maryland's five mass-vaccination sites.
