

## **NEW PCV POLICY: PROOF OF VACCINATION**

As PCV begins to open up a little, for the sake of everyone's safety, the Board has established the following policy for rides, home visits, etc.

If a member and volunteer have reason to meet, the assumption is made that each has been fully vaccinated. In order to confirm this, it is important that the rider/driver as well as the member at home/volunteer show the other their completed vaccination cards. The ride/meeting will proceed only if both can document their vaccination completions (photocopy is fine) to each other.

## COVID RELATED UPDATES

### Preregistration Open to All

Beginning Monday, April 12, all Marylanders 16 and older will be eligible for a vaccine, no matter what provider is giving the vaccination. Residents can preregister for an appointment at a mass vaccination site by visiting <https://onestop.md.gov/preregistration> or calling 1-855-MD-GOVAX (1-855-634-6829). During preregistration, you can choose your top two preferred sites.

All Montgomery County residents can now preregister for an appointment at a County vaccine clinic by visiting [govaxmoco.com](https://govaxmoco.com). Preregistration does not guarantee an appointment. Residents currently eligible under Phase 1 and Phase 2, who have not yet been vaccinated, will continue to be prioritized.

## **Mass Vaccination Site at Montgomery College Germantown**

The vaccination site at Montgomery College's Germantown campus has transitioned to a State-supported mass vaccination site on Thursday, April 8. Vaccinations at MC Germantown will be available to all Marylanders, but about 25% of the appointments will be reserved for Montgomery County residents. If you have already preregistered with the County, no further action is needed.

[Free Ride-On shuttle service](#) will run from the Shady Grove Metro station to the vaccination site at Montgomery College-Germantown, with drop off at the vaccination site. Buses will run every 15 minutes from 8:30 a.m. until 5 p.m. Pick up the shuttle on the east side of the Shady Grove Metro. Buses will be marked "Vaccination Shuttle." If you are driving to the Germantown vaccination site, take Exit 15 (Rt. 118) from I-270 and follow signs to Montgomery College. Free parking is available.

## **Help Reduce Lines at Vaccination Clinics**

To avoid lines and maintain safe distancing, please plan to arrive at a vaccination site no more than 10 minutes before your appointment time. If you do arrive earlier, please remain in your car until 10 minutes before your appointment.

## **Updates about Eligibility to Preregister**

As of Tuesday, March 30, residents age 16 years and older with underlying medical conditions are eligible to preregister for State vaccination sites. Eligibility does not confirm an immediate appointment. Appointments are made based on available vaccine supply.

The Montgomery County health department is continuing to vaccinate all essential employees and residents age 65 and older. These efforts continue to target getting doses to residents in zip codes that have been heavily impacted by COVID-19 deaths (and cases) and to those who have difficulty accessing vaccinations.

Residents are encouraged to preregister with the State and with the County, and to take the first vaccination appointment offered at any clinic.

### **Please Cancel Your Preregistration if Already Vaccinated.**

If you're already been vaccinated, you can now [cancel your preregistration for a County-run clinic](#). Completing this form will remove you from their preregistration list.

### **Keep Getting Tested for COVID-19**

Montgomery County health officials recommend testing at least once each month if you are frequently out in the community. You may test more often if you were not able to follow safety steps like distancing from others and wearing a mask.

While many people with COVID-19 have mild or no symptoms, it is still possible to be infected and pass the disease to friends, family and loved ones. You may have been in close contact with someone with asymptomatic COVID-19 without knowing it. Free testing is provided at numerous locations for anyone who wants one.
