In addition to the April 28 Zoom presentation, we're introducing the *PCV Safe Home Bonus Program* for members. This program offers members a rebate for a home safety improvement, such as installing grab bars, ramps or railings, for up to \$100 or 50% of the cost, whichever is less. PCV members will soon receive specific information on both programs.

The inauguration of the "PCV Safe Home" program is a perfect time for Potomac residents to join PCV and take

advantage of the help and guidance we offer, as well as the rebate program. New members will discover that Potomac Community Village has not only survived the pandemic, but adjusted by creating innovative programming and services to help our members cope during this difficult time and into the future.

I'd also like to point out that non-members are invited to join us for an outdoor walk on Saturday, April 23, at Great Falls Park. Get to know us in person and enjoy nature as we walk on River Trail. RSVPs are required. See below for details.

Maryland Primary Election Date Change

The Maryland Court of Appeal judge tossed out a map of the state's congressional districts after ruling the map was subject to "extreme partisan gerrymandering." A new map, redrawn by legislators, per the court's ruling, was approved and will mean that much of Potomac will be in **district 8**, not district 6. You can see the approved map by clicking MAP. The delay caused by the ruling means that the state's June 28 primary election was moved to a new date of **July 19**. Please take note.

Many Seniors will receive State Tax Reduction

Per a deal Maryland state leaders just announced, many seniors will receive up to a \$1,750 tax cut next year. Up to 80 percent of people 65 and older will see their state income taxes reduced in 2023, as part of Maryland's larger tax cut package. 
Montgomery County Libraries Expand Hours

COVID UPDATE

Free At-home COVID-19 PCR Test Kits Available at County Multiple Locations

Montgomery County residents can pick up free at-home polymerase chain reaction (PCR) COVID-19 test kits at locations throughout the community. The "20/20 GeneSystems" tests are available to County residents while supplies last. Residents can receive a maximum of two test kits per person (each kit contains one test) per visit.

In-person PCR testing continues at multiple sites throughout the community. At-home PCR tests can be picked up, self-administered and then returned to marked drop boxes at the pick-up locations. A schedule of testing locations and other details can be found by clicking PCR TEST.

County Indoor Mask Mandate Lifted... but with Caution

Indoor Mask Mandate Lifted

Montgomery County will suspend its mandate requiring masks or face coverings indoors in locations accessible to the public.

Does not impact mask requirements for Public Schools.

In an update from County Executive Marc Elrich on February 24, "The indoor mask mandate in Montgomery County was lifted this week in accordance with the decision by the County Council. Nevertheless, I will generally continue to wear a mask in indoor public spaces because wearing a mask, as well as being fully vaccinated and boosted, are the best ways to reduce the risk of transmitting and getting COVID-19. With substantial transmission, people who are unvaccinated or not boosted should continue wearing masks in order to stay as safe as possible."

He continues, "It is also important to remember that businesses and other organizations can continue to require customers or visitors to wear a mask in their establishments.

Booster Shots. The Food and Drug Administration has authorized a second booster shot of the Pfizer-BioNTech and Moderna coronavirus vaccines for people 50 and older, a decision intended to help shore up protection against severe illness. This fourth shot was then recommended by the CDC, and can be administered 4 months after the first booster was given.

The Montgomery County Department of Health and Human Services along with private organizations such as pharmacies and health care providers, offer booster shots to everyone over the age of 18. A helpful link for appointments for all three vaccines (Pfizer, Moderna and J&J), can be found by clicking VACCINE ELIGIBILITY. Additionally, to access the easy-to-use Maryland State COVID Vaccine/booster site, click MD VACCINE APPT.

If you need help to make an appointment at a Countyoperated vaccination site, please call the COVID-19 call center at 240-777-2982 Monday through Friday from 9 am to 5 pm. **Free Taxi Cab Service**. For residents 65+ and those with disabilities, free taxi rides to get vaccinations or testing are sponsored by the Montgomery County Department of Transportation.
